

NOTICE OF RACE

1. ORGANIZING AUTHORITY

The event will be organized by Coronado Yacht Club, 1631 Strand Way, Coronado, CA. 92118 in conjunction with Fleet 7 of the Santana 20 Class Association.

2. RULES

The Regatta will be governed by the 'rules' as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing.

3. ENTRY AND ELIGIBILITY

All Santana 20 class members in good standing.

4. REGISTRATION

- 4.1 **The completed entry form and the registration fee, of \$185 if paid by July 17, 2006, or \$200 if paid thereafter, by either check or money order made out to Travis Wilson. Entries must be received no later than Saturday August 5, 2006.** Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Class Championship chairman.

- 4.2 The entry fee will cover the entry, the class-sponsored Post Race Seminars Tuesday and Thursday, the Thursday dinner for the skipper and 2 crew members. Beer and soft drinks after sailing and 1 Class Championship shirt. Additional dinners for family and friends may be purchased at a nominal cost on your entry form. Tuesday Night there will be a cook your own BBQ dinner not included in the Entry fee. On the entry form there will be a place register and pay for the dinner if you want to stay at the club for dinner.

6. MEASUREMENT

- 6.1 Measurement is scheduled for Monday and Tuesday August 7th and 8th, 2006 from 0900 – 1800.
- 6.2 Boats may be measured according to Santana 20 Rules and inspected for safety equipment (article IX section 8 of Santana 20 class rules).
- 6.3 Each competitor's four (4) required class sails must be registered for the championship by being stamped by the championship measurer at CYC. These four (4) sails are the only sails a competitor shall use once racing commences. Substitute sails may be approved by the chairman if a sail is severely damaged.
- 6.4 Only sails that have never been measured and stamped prior to the 2006 championship will be required to be "fully measured" on-site. Sails to be fully measured must be done so on Tuesday during the scheduled measurement times. No sails will be fully measured on Wednesday morning without chairman approval.
- 6.5 A "Competitor Compliance Acknowledgement" will be a part of the measurement form and will cover such items as: required safety gear, visible float marks, etc. A competitor may be subject to random measurement spot checks for compliance by the championship committee at any time during the series.
- 6.6 All boats are subject to additional measurement at any time at the reasonable discretion of the Class or Race Committee.

7. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing Instructions (SI) will be available at registration. Preliminary SI's will be available on the Santana 20 Class Website / Class Championship Link.

8. COURSES

The racing area is in South San Diego Bay, start approximately one half mile windward of government buoy (SD) 30. Courses will be windward/leeward, with offset marks.

9. SCORING

- 9.1 The Low Point scoring system - Appendix A will apply.
- 9.2 Three (3) races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 9.3 When fewer than seven (7) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
- 9.4. When from seven (7) to eight (8) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

10. PRIZES

- 10.1 The Santana 20 Class Championship Trophy for the boat winning the Regatta.
- 10.2 Prizes will be awarded to the skipper and crew of the boats finishing first through tenth (1-10) in the Regatta.
