4. RULES

The Regatta will be governed by the 'rules' as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) 2005-2008, the prescriptions of US SAILING, the Santana 20 Class Rules and this Notice of Race, except as any of these are altered by the Sailing Instructions.

5. ENTRY and ELIGIBILITY

All Santana 20 class members in good standing are eligible to compete.

6. REGISTRATION

- 6.1 The entry form and the registration fee of \$200 value package if paid by May 23, 2007 or \$225 if paid thereafter, by either check or money order made out to Santana 20, Fleet 37 must be submitted. Entries must be received no later than June 16, 2007. Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Class Championship Chairpersons.
- 6.2 The entry fee will cover the entry, the class-sponsored Practice Race Seminar Tuesday, lunches Wednesday – Friday and dinners Tuesday and Thursday for skipper and 2 crew members, beer and soft drinks after sailing, entertainment Thursday night and 3 Class Championship T-shirts per boat. Additional dinners and T-shirts for family and friends may be purchased at a nominal cost on your entry form.
- 6.3 Please note that the registration staff will not be taking fees and applications for Class Association Membership on site. Please join prior to the regatta.

7. LIABILITY RESPONSIBILITY

10. DIRECTIONS

From Tulsa, OK:

Travel west from Tulsa on Hwy. 412 through Sand Springs

Exit, turn north on to 209th West Ave. also called New Prue Rd.

Travel approximately 4.6 miles (pass Big Al's on the right) to Windy Crest Rd.

Turn west (left) on to Windy Crest Rd.

Follow Windy Crest Rd. to the end where the club is located on Keystone Lake.

From I-35:

Travel east on Hwy. 412 also the Cimarron Turnpike across Keystone Lake bridge

Exit, turn north on to 209th West Ave. also called New Prue Rd.

From Oklahoma City, OK:

Travel northeast on I-44

Exit at Bristow, turn north on to Hwy 48

Turn east (right) on to Hwy 412 and travel across the Keystone Lake bridge

12. MEASUREMENT

- 12.1 Measurement is scheduled for Monday, June 18th, 2007, from 0900 to 1800 and Tuesday, June 19th, from 0900 to 1700.
- 12.2 Boats may be measured according to Santana 20 Rules and inspected for safety equipment (article IX section 8 of Santana 20 class rules).
- 12.3 Each competitor's four (4) required class sails must be registered for the championship by being stamped by the championship measurer at WSC. Previously measured and stamped sails constitute compliance with the class rules. These four (4) sails are the only sails a competitor shall use once racing commences. Substitute sails may be approved by the chairpersons if a sail is severely damaged.
- 12.4 Only sails that have never been measured and stamped prior to the 2007 Championship will be required to be "fully measured" on site. Sails to be fully measured must be done so on Tuesday during the scheduled measurement times. No sails will be full measured on Wednesday morning without chairperson approval.
- 12.5 A "Competitor Compliance Acknowledgement" will be a part of the measurement form and will cover such items as: required safety gear, visible float marks, etc. A competitor may be subject to random measurement spot checks for compliance by the championship committee at any time during the series.

13. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing Instruction (SI) will be available at registration.

14. COURSES

The racing area will be on the Arkansas arm of Keystone Lake. Courses will be windward/leeward, with an offset mark.

15. VHF RADIO COMMUNICATIONS

The race committee will attempt to hail all OCS boats and make other race course announcements by VHF radio (channel TBD in the Sailing Instructions).

16. SCORING

- 16.1 The Low Point scoring system – Appendix A will apply.
- 16.2 Three (3) races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 16.3 When fewer than seven (7) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
- 16.4 When from seven (7) to eight (8) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

17. HAUL-OUTS

After the start of Race #1, boats may not come out of the water until completing the regatta without the written approval of the Race Committee Chairman.

18. PRIZES

- 18.1 The Santana 20 Class Championship Trophy for the boat winning the Regatta.
- 18.2 Prizes will be awarded to the skipper and crew of the boats finishing first through fifth (1-5). Finishers sixth through tenth (6-10) will receive one team award each.
- 18.3 In addition there will be "special awards" for deserving actions on the race course.
